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Life Members and Club Patron 'Honour Boards' now a reality!

On Tuesday, 16th April the Honour Boards finally became a reality! The Club's Management Committee and the Kirra Surf Life Saving Supporters Association supported locating the 'Honour Boards' in the Kirra Supporters Club Bar/Bistro. An excellent position to showcase the one hundred and three year history of our Surf Club.



Both Honour Boards are unique in so far as Kirra SLSC has never before (to our knowledge) recognised its Club Patrons in such a distinctive manner; and the Honorary Life Members 'Honour Board' details recipients of Life Membership all areas of across surf lifesaving including Club, Branch, State, Australia and Australian 'Hall of Fame' inductees. I do not believe that a similar display may exist in this format in other surf clubs.

The highest honour that Kirra SLSC can bestow a member is Honorary Life Membership. The new Honour Board gives due recognition to those recipients awarded the Surf Club's – Honorary Life Membership.



The development of these 'Honour Boards' was part of the Kirra Historical Project. The Project Business Case was submitted by the 'Kirra Surf Club Old Boys Association' committee to Kirra SLSC Management in May 2018 and endorsed at the Surf Club's 2018 Annual General Meeting. The Business Case


"(Right) The old and the new! Kirra SLSC clubhouses at Kirra Beach in Year 1936"

The Kirra Pavilion was officially opened and handed to our Surf Club on the 13th April 1936. The formerly owned and built Kirra SLSC clubhouse located on Kirra Point had by this time been removed with both the property and building handed to the Coolangatta Town Council.



"Important information for all current and past members, families and friends associated with the Kirra SLSC"

Kirra SLSC only became aware through an article in the local newspaper that the Pizza Hut lease was to be terminated after more than thirty years. This was just weeks prior to the closing date for 'Submissions of Interest' to be lodged with consultants representing GCCC to occupy this area of the Kirra Pavilion,

Kirra SLSC submitted an 'Expression of Interest'.... The Surf Club's proposal for returning the Kirra Pavilion back to the Club included a five year building redevelopment strategy for the whole Kirra Pavilion for surf lifesaving purposes (including support for the Kirra Surfriders Club). "The Club's proposal never got pass first base!!" Club delegates quickly met the local GCCC Councillor. "This meeting was non-productive with little enthusiasm demonstrated to our delegates in supporting the Kirra SLSC proposal on the future of our Surf Club!" It is rumoured that either an international Restaurant/Bar company from Hawaii USA (Dukes) or a boutique brewery are being considered for the new lease..... "Both options will seriously impact on the local market potential and revenue generation sustainability of Kirra SLSC and its Kirra Supporters Club!!!"

The Surf Club has developed a 'Building Occupancy Assessment Matrix'.... This is an analysis of the current/future mandatory surf lifesaving operational requirements for the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club against the existing allocated occupancy area (our current footprint) within the Kirra Pavilion. "Kirra SLSC has over the past two decades, well and truly outgrown its currently allocated footprint within the Kirra Pavilion!"

Kirra's past/current Club Presidents, Andrew McAuliffe and Michael Hill have continuously attempted to engage with Council on the Club's limited occupancy space and the poor maintenance of the Kirra Pavilion;

With the Surf Club's current accommodation restrictions within the Kirra Pavilion; Council's apparent unwillingness to return the Kirra Pavilion to the Surf Club; Council's heritage building listing of the Kirra Pavilion; and no opportunity to grow the Surf Club's operating accommodation footprint beyond the Kirra Pavilion.... "Such pressures seriously impact on the continuing future of the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club!"

The Kirra Surf Life Saving Club has been providing quality frontline surf lifesaving and community safety services at Kirra Beach and for the people of the Gold Coast, Queensland for more than 103 years!

Club President Michael Hill with assistance from Club Patron Max Winders and several Honorary Life Members, supported of the Club's Management Committee, has again taken the challenge of these ongoing critical issues for our Kirra Surf Life Saving Club to Gold Coast City Council. "KIRRA SLSC JUST WANTS A FAIR GO FROM COUNCIL WITH THE RETURN OF THE KIRRA PAVILION TO THE KIRRA SURF CLUB, WHERE IT BELONGS!"

'The decision - Kirra Pavilion'

Construction of the Kirra Pavilion jointly funded by the Coolangatta Town Council and Queensland Government was for the purpose of providing a new clubhouse for the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club. The building was designated for Kirra Surf Club use at an official ceremony officiated by Mayor SW (Bill) Winders, Coolangatta Town Council in 1936.

Kirra SLSC surf clubhouse since 1936 – 83 years ago! Kirra Pavilion – 'built for the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club'

<u>Extract/s</u>: Kirra SLSC 100 Years by Peter D Kelly, Published 2016: On the 19th August 1935, Kirra SLSC President SW (Bill) Bill Winders OBE, OStJ (Mayor, Coolangatta Town Council) advised the Kirra Surf Club committee that the Coolangatta Town Council had been successful in securing a loan of £2500, and a subsidy of the same amount from the State Government for the erection of new accommodation for the Surf Club. It was to be a 'Depression Era Project' designed to stimulate the local economy. Mr. John Beebe, Architect, acting on instructions from the Council had prepared a sketch plan of a two-story building. Beebe had also designed Brisbane's Hamilton Lawn Bowling Pavilion.

At this meeting, the Kirra SLSC President further advised that in his view the building would cost more than £5000 and the proposed plan was unsuitable. The President thought a more suitable plan would be a single story building, which would be slightly longer. It would also contain a brigade room, committee room, casualty rooms, showers and a surfboat shed. In return the Kirra Surf Club would be required to hand over its present clubhouse building to the Coolangatta Town Council. A proposal was moved and carried that a special Kirra SLSC committee meeting be convened to consider the proposal.

The Kirra Pavilion completed in 1935 was officially opened by the Queensland Minister for Public Instruction and Assistant Treasurer, the Hon. F. A. Cooper on the 13th April 1936. It was built in a Tudor Revival Style. This style was more commonly used for a more affluent building. The Mayor of Coolangatta Town Council, Mr. S.W. (Bill) Winders OBE, OStJ presided over the ceremony.....

The Kirra Surf Club Committee laid out the sum of £54/15/9 to purchase new fittings to comfortably furnish the committee and social room, including a 'President's Chair' and committee table. Club accommodation in the new building also consisted of a bunk room with three tier bunks, a small kitchen and first aid room on the road side. Branching off the bunkroom was one cold shower and one toilet. On the beach side was a committee room containing the beach broadcasting studio and a brigade room where member's lockers were located. The rest of the building was comprised of a men's and lady's dressing rooms with conveniences, showers, lockers and toilets maintained by the Club. A Surf Club office was provided that led to a ladder and the lookout tower 30 feet above ground level. From there, surf lifesavers obtained an excellent view of the beach and surf, and from which warnings could be issued to bathers when necessary. The remaining small section was intended for café purposes and included rooms for a Surf Club caretaker.

In return for occupancy in the new building, the Kirra SLSC handed over to the Coolangatta Town Council its Surf Club building of three levels occupied since 1922. Built by the Kirra Surf Club at a cost of just over £900, the building appreciated in value over thirteen years to £1,200. Parts of this building were later used in the construction of facilities at Bilinga and Rainbow Bay. (End of Extract/s)


