Kirra SLSC - Ronald 'Ron' Marchant

On Sunday 25th March I was informed by KSLSC Life Member Keith Boucher that fellow past member and Kirra SLSC champion competitor Ron Marchant passed away peacefully on the 22nd March 2018 at the age of 90 years.

Ron joined the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club during the World War Two years and gained his Bronze Medallion on the 22nd January 1944 (Award Number: 19579). He was a member of the legendary Kirra R & R Team that were victorious in winning the Australian R & R Premier Event at the 1947 Australian Surf Life Saving Championship held at Coolangatta Beach.

This was a first for a Kirra SLSC 'R & R Team' to win this Australian Premier Event. It was also the first occasion that the event had been won by a team outside the Sydney NSW surf lifesaving clubs; and only the second occasion up to that time for a Kirra SLSC member/s to achieve a 'Gold Medal' at an Australian Surf Life Saving Championship (first was Jack Ajax – 1929 Australian Belt Champion).

I know that you join with me in acknowledging an outstanding surf lifesaving competitor and champion, club member and Kirra SLSC legend. We offer our deepest sympathies to Ron Marchant's family for their loss.

"Is that you?" Two of our long serving past members Bob (Polo) Wilson and Glen (Floss) Winstanley were like ships passing in the night when they recently came face to face with each other in the reception of a Logan City Medical Centre. Having not seen each other for many years, it was several sneaky glances and grins before they acknowledged: "Is that you!"...... Both probably claim that they haven't changed in appearance over the years.... "Yea right!" Glen and Polo's eldest son Kirk Wilson were active members together in Kirra and good mates.

Glen Winstanley was an outstanding surf lifesaving competitor in swim, board and ski, and ironman events: 1984 Australian Champion – Cadet R & R; 1985 Branch Champion – Junior R & R (6 person); 1987 Branch Champion – Malibu Board and Junior R & R (6 person); 1988 Branch Champion – Senior R & R (6 person); 1989 Branch Champion – Open Taplin Relay (first and only time Kirra has won this event); 1990 Queensland Champion – Dearlove Relay (another first and only for Kirra)..... "To list a few of his numerous wins and placings in Branch, State, and Australian events". He was also Club Captain for the 1993 – 1994 season. In 1994 Glen relocated for work to Papua New Guinea where he successfully developed his business enterprise over the next two decades. He now lives back in south-east Queensland with his family.



"Milestone achieved in Rugby Union!" It was a great day at the famous Crosby Park (Brothers Rugby Union Club home ground) on Saturday, 24th March when 'Kirra Old Boys' member Alan Beauchamp and wife Pam's youngest son Luke play his 100th game in Premier Grade for the mighty Brethren. Only forty-eight players have achieve this milestone since World War Two....It was a tremendous effort given that Luke has not played for some 18 months whilst recovering from previous football injuries. Luke was again appointed Captain of the Brothers Premiers Team for the 2018 football season.

GPS won the points for the match, however it was a determined leadership game displayed by the Brothers Captain....."We done Luke!"

It was like a who's who at the game with 'Kirra Old Boys' Ian Sommer, Ron Gurnett, Greg Ward, and Peter Beauchamp enjoying the hospitality tent provided by hosts Alan and Pam Beauchamp for their family and friends"

Driving down memory lane!

Jet Rescue Boats (JRBs) were new to Queensland surf lifesaving with the first jet powered rescue boat owned and operated by the Southport Surf Club in the late 1960's. Kirra SLSC Management Committee saw the value in JRBs for surf rescue, in particular for performing rescues during the occasion of large and dangerous seas (no IRB's during this era). Further, given the little beach available at Kirra Beach in the early 1970's, JRBs provided another incentive to encourage member involvement in surf safety and patrol activities on weekends. Finance was secured through the generous sponsorship from KD Morris, owner of the Kirra Beach Hotel. The first Kirra SLSC owned Jet Rescue Boat (Smith design) was operational in the latter months of the 1972/1973 season.



For this first year (1973) of Kirra's JRB surf patrols, four club members were chosen as the inaugural JRB Drivers. It was a great learning opportunity for club members to be part of the JRB Crew and observe these new JRB Drivers going through their instruction in all types of surf conditions. The original four Kirra SLSC members obtaining their JRB Power Boat Medallion were Ron Halpin (KSLSC Life Member – 1965); Max Klingner (KSLSC Life Member – 1954); Rick Sellwood (KSLSC Life Member – 1981); and Les Sellwood (KSLSC Life Member – 1980).

In 1974 Club Vice-Captain Peter Beauchamp (KSLSC Life Member – 1986) and Club Captain Barrie Thorne (KSLSC Life Member – 1977) were next to gain their JRB Power Boat Medallion assessed by Alan Seeney of the Southport Club. Alan was the first to be appointed as a Queensland SLSA – JRB Examiner. Blair Carter (Club Vice-Captain 1974/1975) soon followed and obtained his JRB driver qualifications. Long serving club member Barry Cameron (KSLSC Life Member – 1976) gained his JRB Power Boat Medallion during the club's 1975/1976 season. From these early beginnings members of the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club continued to remain actively involved as qualified operators of Jet Rescue Boats in Queensland for almost fifty years.

JRBs had proven to be an exceptional surf rescue community service. With an experienced crew, the JRB could negotiate the largest of surf conditions where no other surf lifesaving rescue appliance could affect the rescue. In June 2016, Surf Lifesaving Queensland terminated the provision of JRB Surf Patrols for the Gold Coast and Sunshine Coast. "Jet Rescue Boat surf safety and ocean rescue — 1968 to 2016"

Extract: Kirra SLSC 100 years by PD Kelly: Page 180: "Many were the fears expressed by the critics and the 'experts' that the boat would not be able to handle heavy seas, that a big dumper would wreck it, that mechanical contrivances were dangerous in the hands of the inexperienced, that given a few months the lack of care and attention by club members would result in it being unreliable and out of commission when required, and so on.......

How wrong the 'experts' were was amply proved once the boat was commissioned (early 1973). It handled the biggest seas with ease, it effected rescues and had those in trouble back on the beach while swimmers and boards were still getting to the victim, it kept a watchful eye on unpatrolled beaches, its radio communications and high speed enabled it to be quickly at any point where it was needed, and it was invaluable for laying buoys and doing other back work necessary to conduct a Surf Carnival.......The power boats became an essential part of Life Saving equipment and another means of ensuring our beaches remained safe for the surfing public".
