This year also saw 7Eleven come back on board as the sponsor of the nipper rashies. This sponsorship ensure that every nipper received a free rash shirt at the start of the season. A special thank you to Pat Nielsen for her continued support of the club, donating \$500 each year. Your kindness is greatly appreciated.

Without these grants and sponsorships, the club could not provide the services needed to keep our beaches safe for the tourists and local residents.

# Treasurer

During the financial Year ended 30th April 2020, the club experienced a situation like no other. Covid-19 hit us at the worst possible time with all our major fundraising events having to be cancelled during February – June.

The total revenue for 2019/20 was \$230,431. This is a moderate decrease of approximately \$48,559 from the previous year. Some notable increases/decreases were attributed mainly to the following:

- Decrease in Building Maintenance spending as last season we completed the Bathroom renovations which are still looking terrific.
- Increase in wages – due to Kathy's entitlements being paid out when she retired in December 2019
- Membership increased with Nipper numbers up for the season and an ever-growing IRB team.
- House to House collections by club members was down by over \$3,360. This is very concerning and will need to be a priority in the 2020/21 season to get all members on board for club fundraising.

By keeping our expenses down and making savings where possible we were able to minimise the loss of income and had a net surplus of \$22,113. This is a great achievement considering we lost over \$15,000 in major fundraising events this season (Three Ocean swims, Cooly Classic, Cooly Rocks BBQ, Hosting 2 carnivals).

Thank you to the Kirra Supporters Club for again supplying our Patrol Meals/Vouchers for the season which saves the club over \$7,000.

Thank you also to the Gold Coast City Council for their generous donation of \$25,000 for the Kirra Master Plan, which will allow us to get architect drawings and concept plans for the future Building renovations.

To our members, I would like to thank each and every one of you, for your dedication to saving lives. To Kathy and Gabrielle, no words can describe the gratitude I have for you, for everything that you do behind the scenes. Thank you for being the backbone of the office and keeping everyone organised.

To Anthony, Shayna and Hayden, you are my world and I would like to say thank you for your support in my roles at this terrific place that I will always call my second home. Thank you for loading cars, setting up tables, wrapping prizes, carrying boxes and missing out on family time because meetings have run over time or we were just too busy doing 'surf club stuff'. Thank you for just always being there no matter what.

Kirra Surf Lifesaving Club, thank you for again pushing me to new heights, for believing in me even when I didn't believe in myself, thank you for giving me friendships that will last a lifetime and most of all thank you for making me a better person for having the opportunity to volunteer at such an iconic organisation.



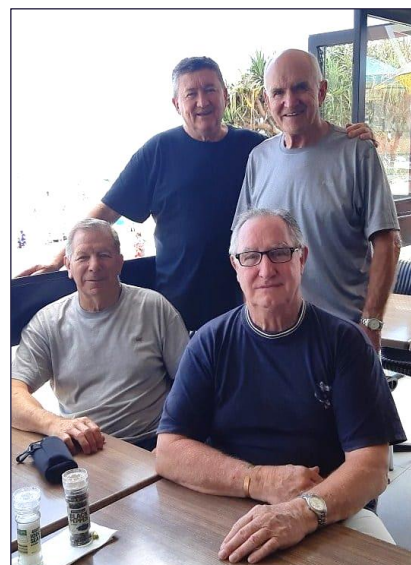

# Grievance Officer

I open my report acknowledging the service of Kirra SLSC previous Grievance Officer Paul Bertini. Paul served the Surf club for fifteen years in this role prior to myself taking over the role for the 2019/20 season. Outstanding dedication and as I have learned this position has inherited characteristics which can be challenging.

Occasionally members of Kirra SLSC and or members of the public will have Grievances over incidents that have occurred. Issues have occurred this season and for future reference this is the process.

Resolve the issue yourself by approaching the other member or members involved. It is not a case of winning the issue, the aim is to resolve the issue.

Next if that is not possible then the Grievance officer will become involved. The Grievance Officer will gather information with the intent to work out a fair and impartial outcome between those involved.

The Grievance process does not replace the club's disciplinary procedure if club rules or discipline are breached.

When I took on this role for the 2019/20 season my intent was to have issues presented to me resolved quickly as possible. A delayed resolution and recommendation may have a detrimental effect mentally then physically on those involved then it becomes a welfare and member retention concern.

This season I was presented with a Grievance by a member of the public concerning Kirra members. I write this in my report to make members aware that the greater the number of visitations to our beach increases the probability of challenging situations occurring.

In this situation it was fortunate that the patrol on duty at the time had a wealth of life experience, conducted themselves in an exemplary manner and diffused a difficult situation. It was concluded that the Grievance complaint was unwarranted.

Internally there were no grievances that were member to member issues. However, there were circumstantial grievances that of which members had concerns.

Three sources of reference that are elements of the current Bronze courses are the Patrol Operations Manual, current SLSQ/A Policies and our constitution. Consulting these references may either negate or substantiate members' concerns.

In conclusion member issues may be prevented by a preseason Club Captain meeting with the clubs Patrol Captains. The intent of this meeting is to refresh member knowledge of the contents of the patrol operations manual, SLSQ/A policies and the clubs constitution and what is expected of members for the 2020/21 season.

The Patrol Captains then will pass this information onto their patrol members.

It was suggested at this time that a positive financial operating outcome could be achieved by the end of the 2019/2020 financial period. *"This would be a first for several years!"*

Federal and State COVID-19 mandatory sanctions imposed nationally, including the closure of all licenced hotels, clubs, restaurants and other businesses from midday on Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> March 2020 has required the (Kirra SLSC) association committee to adjust its end-of-year business projections. However, with the business restructure implemented and achieved, the future operation of the licensed Kirra Beach Surf Club in a post COVID-19 trading period is looking positive.

## **Committee – Kirra Surf Life Saving Supporters Association:**

The following Kirra SLSC members support the functions of the association's committee for the 2019/2020 business operating period. Several of these members are also actively involved and support the surf club as elected officers of the Kirra SLSC management committee and the Kirra Surf Club Old Boys Association. President: Michael Hill, Deputy President: Paul Cameron, Secretary: Peter Beauchamp, Finance Officer/Accountant: Loretta Cassone, Treasurer: Barry Cameron, Member: Anthony Cassone, Member: Cheryl Fenton, Member: Gaven Gear *Resigned 24<sup>th</sup> March 2020*, Club Manager: Patrik Holmkvist (*Appointed 4<sup>th</sup> December 2019*)

**Staffing:** Over the past several months there have been a number of staff movements for the licensed club. With the departure of the previous club manager in November 2019, the position was publicly advertised. A significant number of applications were received and several were short-listed for interview. The successful applicant demonstrated a wealth of knowledge and experience within the hospitality industry, including his ability to lead and manage staff to achieve quality customer outcomes.

**COVID-19:** The closure of the licensed Kirra Beach Surf Club on the 24<sup>th</sup> March 2020 was a mandatory condition of the COVID-19 sanctions implemented by Federal/State

Governments. This closure impacted on many businesses with thousands of permanent and casual staff unemployed, including those of our small charity-based business.

The association's committee made the difficult decision on closure of the licensed club to discontinue the employment of the casual staff. Both the club manager and head chef (only permanent positions) were retained and strategies implemented to support these permanent positions. Patrik and Ben introduced a 'Takeaway' initiative that will continue post COVID-19. It was crucial to maintain the employment of the club's leadership team utilising the Federal Government's Job Keeper Program to ensure that the licensed club was prepared and, in a position, to successfully reopen on the lifting of government sanctions.

**Building for future success:** The rejuvenation and success of the licensed Kirra Beach Surf Club is dependent upon many factors, none more important than the demonstrated support shown by all Kirra SLSC current and past members, families and supporters. The association's committee along with the licensed Kirra Beach Surf Club leadership team and staff recognise and acknowledge the encouragement and generous support offered by the committee and membership of the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club. Continuing to build inclusiveness and ownership of the licensed club are critical elements for achieving success, not only for the licensed Kirra Beach Surf Club but also for the future benefit of the Kirra Surf Life Saving Club and the broader membership.

A full report on the association and the licensed Kirra Beach Surf Club business and financial activities for the 2019/2020 period will be presented at the Kirra Surf Life Saving Supporters Association – Annual General Meeting scheduled for August 2020.

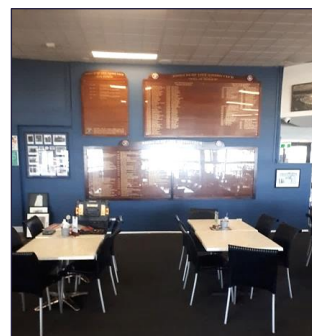

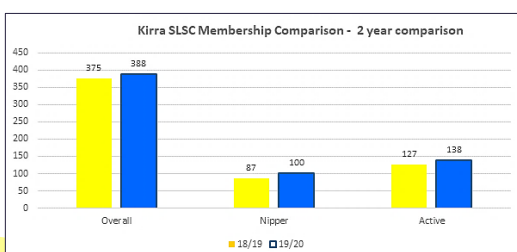

Our deepest sympathies are offered to Rick Wortley's family for their sad loss.

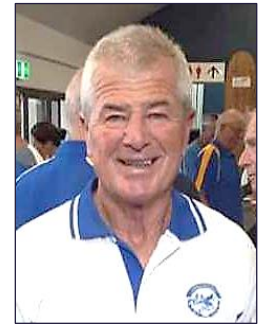
## **Vale – Beth Carseldine**

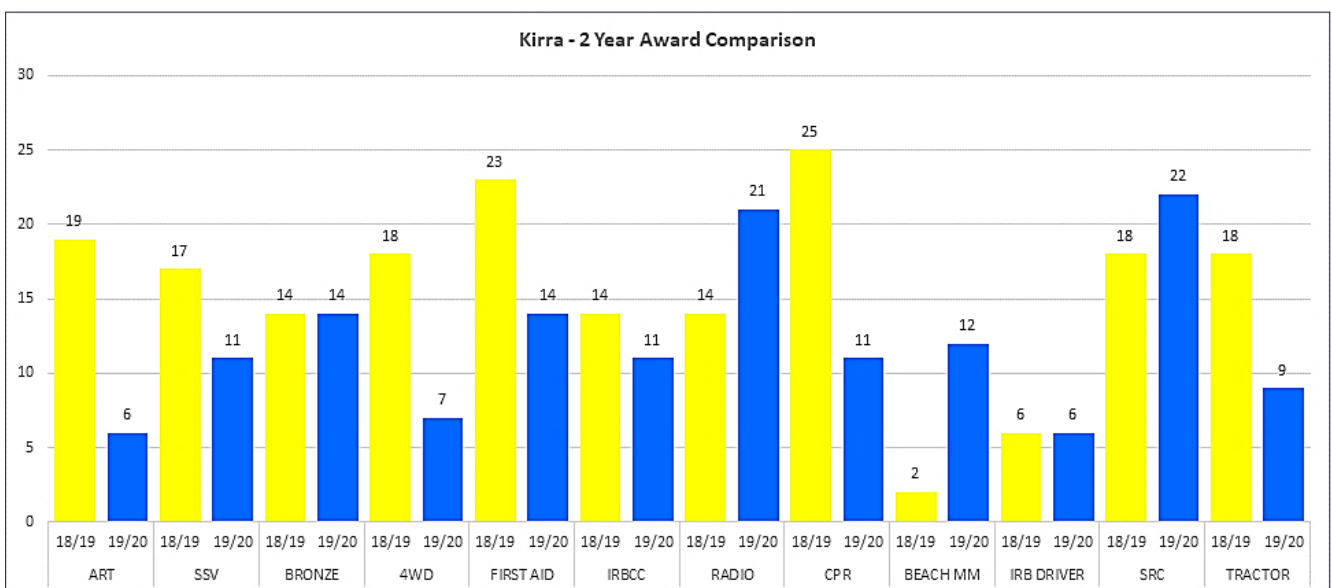


## Vale - Ian (Elke) Sommer
