Chief Lifeguard Warren Young - City of Gold Coast

After almost fifty years in his job, CoGC Chief Lifeguard Warren Young has called it and retired. A friend and colleague to many of the Kirra Surf Club, Warren has spent most of his adult life patrolling some of the busiest beaches in Australia, pulling struggling swimmers to safety, and coordinating the nation's largest unit of professional lifeguards. Highly respected amongst his peers locally and internationally, he built a Lifeguard Service to match the growth demands for the City of Gold Coast with the provision of safe bathing beaches.

Warren joined the Mermaid Beach SLSC as a teenager and has been a member there for fifty-three years supporting and encouraging fellow clubbies in providing a safe beach for bathers.

As a tribute to his professionalism and dedication to duty, Warren was recently named as the City of Gold Coast '2021 Citizen of the Year'. His lifeguard service will be remembered with the CoGC Burleigh Heads Lifeguard Centre named after him. Mayor Tom Tate officially unveiled the newly renamed 'Warren Young Lifeguard Centre'. A world first - Introduction of Expired Air Resuscitation

<u>Extract</u>: Web: Wikipedia articles on Expired Air Resuscitation; Professor Tess Cramond; SLSAA; Others: Earle Smith AM (Kirra SLSC), Alan Doig OAM (Burleigh Heads SLSC), Jack Dearlove MBE (Mooloolaba SLSC), and Bruce Campbell AM MBE (Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC) volunteered and participated in an Australian first (possibly a world first) demonstration of the success of Expired Air Resuscitation as live patients at the St Andrews Hospital, Brisbane in November 1961.

Under the supervision of **Professor Tess Cramond AO OBE** (nee Brophy) and her colleague **Doctor Roger Bennett** (SLSAA Medical Advisor), this incredible trial saw these four brave surf lifesavers voluntarily being placed into unconsciousness and their breathing halted to allow experimental Expired Air Resuscitation (mouth-to-mouth) to be conducted on them. Each volunteer was individually placed into this coma state on multiple occasions during the trial and kept alive using ground-breaking Expired Air Resuscitation techniques applied by a number of medical practitioners, police officers, and emergency service providers. "The world owes a huge debt to these four brave men and Queensland Surf Lifesavers!"

Professor Cramond and Doctor Bennett's recommendations following this trial led to changes in rescue services and improved survival rates. Their work with surf lifesaving in conjunction with the Australian Resuscitation Council ultimately led to enhanced community training in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), and for CPR Signs being mandatory for all backyard and public pools displaying basic CPR techniques. In 1961, SLSAA Medical Officer Dr Roger Bennett recommended the introduction of Expired Air Resuscitation to the World Conference on Resuscitation held in Sydney.

Professor Tess Cramond AO OBE was an innovator in rescue and resuscitation techniques, a pioneer of Expired Air Resuscitation, and a genuine lifesaver in the truest sense of the word. Her research and findings would go on to transform rescue services and dramatically lift the survival rates of patients rescued from the surf. Her work, and that of Doctor Bennett and the four volunteer casualties not only helped world surf lifesaving organisations develop better methods of resuscitation, but also assisted humanity reduce the mortality rate resulting from drowning and the many other threats to life resulting from respiratory failure.

After Doctor Bennett's death due to cancer in 1967, Professor Cramond took up the challenging issue of pain management. She continued with her commitment to surf lifesaving and remained as the Association's Medical Adviser for more than thirty years. She also advised the Queensland Electricity Commission's Safety Advisory Board from 1976 to 1987 on appropriate rescue and resuscitation techniques for power industry workers operating in the field. Professor Tess Cramond AO OBE (1926 – 2015) was awarded Honorary Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Queensland and the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia. She died on the 26th December 2015. (End of Extract)



Earle Smith AM is a Member of the Order of Australia; Inductee to Surf Lifesaving Australia – Hall of Fame; and an Honorary Life Member of Surf Life Saving Australia, Surf Life Saving Queensland, the Point Danger Branch SLSQ, and his Kirra Surf Life Saving Club (KSLSC Hon. Life Member #23/1953). He was a past Queensland and Australian surf lifesaving champion who also trained many surf sports champions from not only his surf club but other surf lifesaving clubs in the SLSQ Point Danger Branch.

Earle held numerous surf lifesaving committee positions at Club, Branch and State levels. He was an accredited Surf Carnival Official and officiated at all competition levels in surf lifesaving, including for several decades at Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships. He dedicated his life to supporting youth education and development; and the advancement of the surf lifesaving movement throughout Australia and locally for his beloved Kirra Surf Life Saving Club (Est: 7th January 1916).

An iconic surf lifesaver, he will be remembered as a man who did it his way who left legacies in surf lifesaving that will live on forever. He was one of those several surf lifesaving and surf club legends acclaimed at the Kirra SLSC – 100 Years Celebration Dinner held in January 2016. Earle Smith AM

(1926 – 2012) passed away on the 7th August 2012. "He was a Kirra SLSC colleague, mentor, leader, and a dear friend to many in surf lifesaving who is sadly missed at his local Kirra Beach".

In such a short period of time since August 2018, goals achieved for the Historical Project have included:

- Researched, designed and constructed the Kirra SLSC Life Members Honour Board:
- Coordinated a generous donation offsetting the cost of the Life Members 'Honour Board';
- Researched, designed and constructed the Kirra SLSC Patrons Honour Board;
- Coordinated and sponsored the Kirra SLSC *Life Members return to Kirra* event;
- Presented a unique Kirra SLSC Life Member's Cap to each Life Member;
- Designed and presented the 'IRB Champions (2018) Photo Display';
- Researched, designed and constructed the *Kirra SLSC Australian Champions Honour Board*;

The following tasks for the Kirra Historical Project are currently being finalised, including:

- Achieved a financial grant of \$10,000 from the Australian Government to construct a **WW1/WW2 Veterans' Commemorative Memorial** at Kirra Beach (near and/or in front of the surf club) recognising the heroic service of Kirra SLSC members in defence of Australia during WW1 and WW2. Names are with the Stone mason to complete construction of the memorial (March 2021);
- <u>Finalised</u> the research and design for the Sports Champions Photographic Gallery of Kirra SLSC **World and Australian Champions**; and
- Finalised the research and design of the *Kirra SLSC Queensland Champions Honour Board*.
